TRICKS, TREATS & TOXIC SWEETS

HOW TO KEEP YOUR PETS SAFE THIS HALLOWEEN!

LEAVE THEM AT HOME!

Be sure to take pets out before dark, if necessary. Be aware of any candy or wrappers on the ground. The commotion can cause your pet stress, so it may best to leave them home on Halloween night. Keep a eye on your pets with a dark/black coat, Halloween night can be dangerous, especially for cats!



BEWARE OF GLOWSTICKS!

While glowsticks are mildly toxic to pets, they taste very bitter and can cause foaming & drooling, and can irritate skin and eyes. The plastic can cause a blockage if ingested, so be sure to keep pets away from all glowsticks + glowstick jewelry.



BEWARE OF COSTUMES!

If you choose to dress your pet up, make sure the costume does not restrict your pets movement or vision, and be sure to use a costume with no dangly or small pieces that could be chewed off. Be sure to monitor your pet at all times while wearing the costume.



Be sure to secure all decorations, and keep pets away from decor and electrical wires!



KEEP CANDY AWAY!

Exert extra caution with Halloween candies or other edible goodies. Store candy in a place where your pet cannot access, and clean up any leftovers or wrappers, ensuring they are also not within your pet's reach.

Beware of chocolate, candies containing xylitol, nuts, raisins, chewy/sticky candies or gummies, hard candies, lollipops, etc. Many of these candies are toxic, a choking hazard, or could cause an intestinal blockage.

SOCIALIZING dogs is different than what you might have been led to believe. We think a social dog is one that enjoys racing and wrestling at the dog park or day care. But that should not be our main goal as dog owners and for many dogs it's simply not a realistic goal.

Many dogs are not comfortable playing with strangers. And in a natural setting, they wouldn't. Dogs are territorial by nature and are perfectly satisfied only interacting with their own family.

So if your dog is not a social butterfly, that's perfectly fine and natural. Don't feel bad. HOWEVER- the true definition of "socializing" is sharing space.

Every dog and every owner should learn how to control their dog and be peaceful in the presence of other dogs and people.

Whether you're in the veterinary office waiting room, or passing someone at the park, your dog needs to learn to ignore others.

A big mistake that I see as a professional trainer is that owners allow every dog and every person to interact or touch their dog from the first time they take him out. So the dog is excited and overstimulated and ignores the owner because he is getting so much feedback from everyone else.

Overstimulation often leads to reactivity- not because your dog is mean- but because his emotions are out of control.

So practice being calm and ignoring everyone else. Use high value treats to reward your dog for listening to you. Move away and correct when he's overstimulated. Pass and ignore way more people/dogs than you interact with so your dog doesn't expect to "say hi" to everyone while tuning you out.

Lastly, keep your leash short in public spaces and never allow your dog to approach another dog or person without their permission. Respect the personal space of others. Many dogs don't want your dog in their space and they have every right to mind their business and be out and about like you.

Be safe. Be happy. Be in control!


Mamacita
